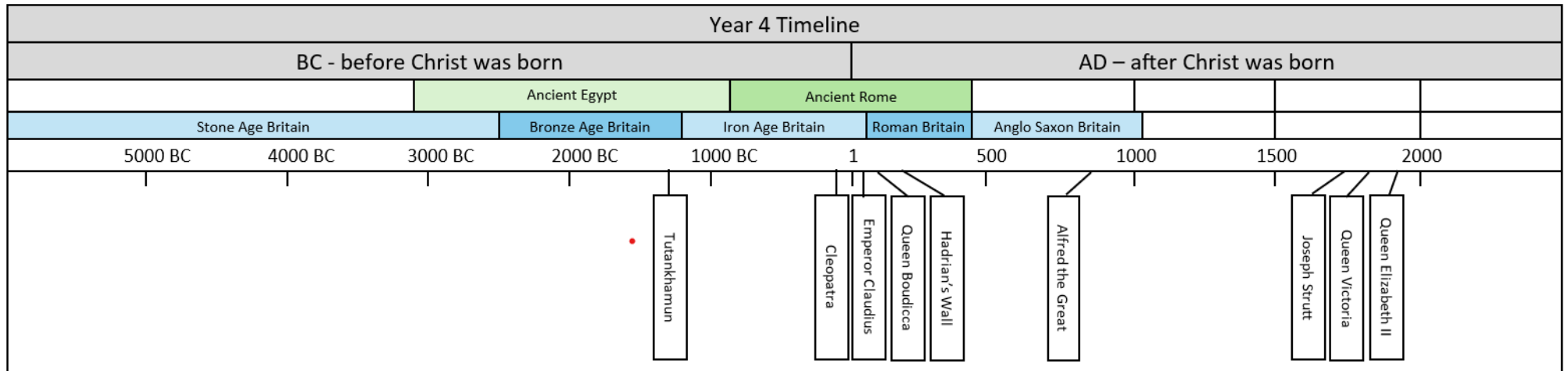
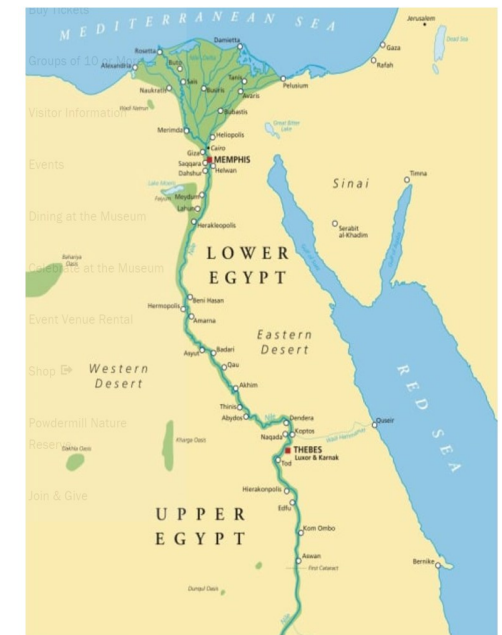


What were the causes and consequences of Ancient Egypt?






The Egyptians left lots of things to the world.

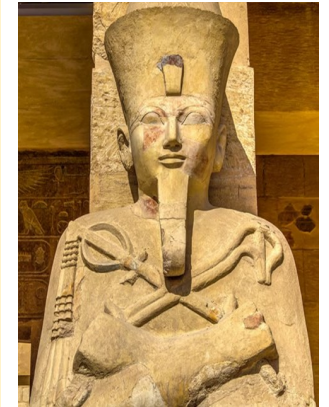
Hatshepsut

One of only a few female pharaohs - she proved female pharaohs could be powerful.

Considered one of Egypt's greatest pharaohs Hatshepsut brought great wealth and artistry to her land.

She sponsored a trading expedition which brought back gold, ebony and incense.

She built structures that still stand today.



Akhenaton

He was an Egyptian pharaoh. He is famous for changing Egyptian religion. Egyptians worshipped lots of Gods but he wanted them to worship one god—the sun god.

He closed many old temples and built new ones. This made him very unpopular. When he died the Egyptians went back to believing in many gods.

He also made changes to Egyptian art.
